Dear Ms. Rice,

I think the time has come to involve as many outside resources, as we can, regarding the future and status of Belmont's Historic Structures.

A recent recommendation, by the Grade Separation Task Force would adversely effect a bldg. known as the "Country Store". I have enclosed pictures and a copy of a Historic Resources Inventory on that particular structure.

I have recently written a letter to Mr. Marcus, owner of the Country Store(copy enclosed) which states our concerns. He had written to the City Council of Belmont and requested action because he felt that as an Antique Retail Store outlet it would lose it's effectiveness.

We as a group, The Belmont Historical Society, The AAUW of Belmont and San Carlos recently completed an Historical Resources Inventory. The research, for Belmont has been published and is awaiting perusal by the city of Belmont.

As this situation progresses, we hope you can advise us as to what you might see as an alternative after checking the enclosed information.

Dear Mr. Marcus,

I recently read your letter of Oct. 28 to the city council and can understand your concern about your bldg. at 700 Ralston. As you probably know a task force has just completed a feasibility study to determine the best possible program regarding a Grade Separation at Ralston and Old County Rd. We feel that any action that is determined, would greatly impact on your buildings future.

We have recently completed an Historical Resources Inventory, sponsored by the City of Belmont under the auspices of the San Mateo Historical Society. This study was completed June of 91 and is now in the hands of the City of Belmont for their perusal. Enclosed is a copy and background information on the bldg. at 700 Ralston.

Our position is not one of interference, but of concern and integrity for the Bldg.'s in Belmont that are identified as having Historical significance.

The City has recently updated and adopted an Ordinance which would protect many of these structures. We would like to discuss these concerns with you and would be happy to meet with you at your convenience. We have a History Room in the Manor Bldg. in Twin Pines Park which might be a convenient place to meet. I can be reached at my home phone, 591-4270
